RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. This is a county fair and entries should be made or grown by residents of Davie County. All items must have been made or grown by the person entering the exhibit.
- 2. All entries must have been completed within the past twelve months. <u>Items entered in a previous fair may not be re-entered.</u>
- 3. Exhibitors may enter only one item in each class.
- 4. Exhibitors must register with the fair secretary (at *the Arbor*) and obtain an exhibitor's number. This number must be placed on each exhibit entered.
- 5. Entries will be accepted on Friday, September 13 from 5:00 p.m. 8:00 p.m. and on Saturday, September 14 from 7:30 a.m. 9:00 a.m. Item(s) will not be accepted after 9:00 a.m.
- 6. **Entries must remain on exhibit until 3:00 p.m. on fair day.** Exhibitors are expected to abide by this rule.
- 7. Exhibitors **will not** be permitted in the Community Building and Arbor during judging. *Areas will be secured during judging*.
- 8. Specific rules for judging are listed with the department's divisions.
- 9. Cash prizes and ribbons will be awarded to winners in each class as published. Ribbons will be attached to the winning article. Cash prizes will be awarded at 3:00 p.m. Prize monies not picked up during the designated time will be retained by Center Fair.
- 10. **Best of Show** prizes and ribbons will be awarded as listed only if three or more articles are entered in the department/class. When insufficient entries, the Best of Show ribbons may be awarded according to the judge's discretion.
- 11. The Center Community Development Association, sponsor of the Center Fair, will not be liable for loss or damage to property or any bodily injury.



It All Began in 1924

A Brief History of the Center Fair

1924 is when the Center Fair really began. In those days the Historic Center Arbor was just 48 years old and, in fact, Davie County itself was a mere 88 years old. Nationally, Calvin Coolidge was President and the first Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade was coming in November. Things were pretty prosperous and we were in the thick of the "roaring twenties."

In the Center Community a group of people met and organized the first Center Fair which was open to all residents of Davie County to enter. Apparently the Center folks had held their own small fair for a few years for just the local community. This fair would be larger and would be open to all residents of Davie County. It was held at the Historic Center Arbor. According to newspaper articles of the time the early fair was not held on a weekend like it is now. It was actually held on WEDNESDAY, October 22nd. In 1925 the date was moved to the last Wednesday in September and in 1926 it expanded to include a second day on Thursday. The event included many categories that are still around today but at that time they also judged livestock including cows, pigs, chickens, etc.

After the hugely successful fair of 1926 it seems Center had outgrown its available space. Plans were made to merge the Center Fair organization with another group and create a new fair located in Mocksville called the Davie County Fair. This fair was held at the Masonic Picnic Grounds starting the following year and ran from 1927 through 1938. After that time the Center Grange held a couple of fairs. In 1954 Center Community revived the fair again and around that time the community began holding barbecues and other events to raise money for the new Center Volunteer Fire Department which was founded in 1957.

Today the annual Center Fair and Barbecue draw large crowds over two days (Friday & Saturday) in early September. As in the beginning it continues to be open to ALL RESIDENTS of Davie County. Today the fair includes craft vendors, tents for local community organizations, and antique tractors in addition to the fair exhibits and categories for all ages in the Center Arbor and Center Community Building...plus a few thousand pounds of smoked pork barbecue too!
